

Greater Miami and Miami Beach is spread over 2,431 square miles (6,296 square kilometers) of land and water at the southeastern tip of the Florida peninsula. The Intracoastal Waterway separates the Miami mainland and Miami Beach, located on the Atlantic Ocean. More than 2.7 million people reside here, bringing to the area a rich cultural diversity.

Currency

The national currency of Miami, Florida is the American Dollar (USD) and supplied by the U.S. Federal Reserve. American paper currency come in seven denominations: \$1, \$2, \$5, \$10, \$20, \$50, and \$100.

Language

English is the official language in Miami, but due to the large immigration of people from various Spanish speaking regions, Spanish is also a dominant language and is spoken by 60% of the population.

Gratuities

Customarily, gratuities of 18 to 20 percent are paid to hospitality industry personnel who render personal services. You may find a restaurant has already added the gratuity to the bill.

Taxes

Sales tax in Miami-Dade County is 7 percent. Hotel taxes (including sales tax) range from 11 to 14 percent depending on the location of the property.

Driving & Traffic Regulations

Texting and driving is prohibited in Florida. U.S. law stipulates driving on the right-hand side of the road and passing on the left. Right turns are permitted at red lights unless otherwise indicated. Always note posted speed limits. All persons riding in an automobile are required to wear seatbelts. Children under five years of age must be fastened securely in government-approved child car seats.



Division of Drivers Licenses: 305/229-6333. The State of Florida recognizes valid U.S. driver licenses, international driver licenses and valid licenses in other countries. **Tow-away Zones:** Tow-away zones are indicated by signs posted at the curb.

Liquor Laws & Smoking

The legal drinking age is 21. Smoking and vaping are prohibited inside restaurants in Miami-Dade County.





PADDOCK ACCESS - COVID-19 CODE OF CONDUCT



The revolutionary changes have been designed to promote better racing. The 2022 regulations, originally slated to arrive in 2021 but delayed by Covid-19, had one guiding principle: to allow closer racing - with the potential for more overtakes a happy, but secondary, benefit.

1. Changes to loss of downforce

Research has shown that the downforce loss resulting from the 'dirty air' being churned chaotically off a leading car previously led to a loss of 25% downforce when running three car lengths behind a leading car (approximately 20 metres, measured from the lead car's nose to the following car's nose), while closing up to one car length (around 10 metres) results in a 47% loss.

The 2022 car, developed by Formula 1's in-house Motorsports team in collaboration with the FIA, and putting a heavy onus on the aerodynamic phenomenon known as 'ground effect' reduces those figures to 4% at 20 meters, rising to just 18% at 10 metres.

2. Feature of over-wheel winglets and wheel covers

Two of the striking features on the 2022 car are its over-wheel winglets and a return to a feature last seen in F1 in 2009 - wheel covers.

The inclusion of the latter is simple: sending airflow through the wheels might be an enormously potent way for teams to increase their downforce, but it also adds to that chaotic aerodynamic wake coming off the cars.

Although there have been changes to the 2022 regulations to limit what teams can do around the tyres aerodynamically, F1's Motorsports team wanted to take a belt-and-braces approach by adding a physical seal to prevent engineers intentionally directing disruptive airflow out through the wheels.

As for the over-wheel winglets, their job is to help control the wake coming off the front tyres and direct it away from the rear wing. That's been a role traditionally performed by vortices from the front wing - but in a way that makes them hugely sensitive when running in following car conditions. The winglets will achieve the same thing, but in a way that is more aerodynamically resilient in close racing.

3. Feature of 18-inch low-profile tyres

The new Pirelli compounds and constructions for these 18-inch tyres have been designed with the goal of reducing the amount the tyres overheat when they slide - a primary aspect that should help with closer racing.

The lower profile tyres also have the added benefit of reducing the sidewall deflection changes and the resulting aerodynamic wake effect that occurs. The teams spend a lot of effort on simulating the airflow regimes around the tyre shapes and interactions with the car bodywork. Reducing the sensitivity in this area will be a benefit in both the car design process and resource required - something that's particularly important in the era of the cost cap.

4. New design of front wing and nose to prevent outwash

Although front wings have been getting progressively simpler in recent seasons, the 2022 F1 car will feature a totally new front wing shape.

Keeping with the philosophy of the 2022 car, the new front wing's job is to both generate consistent downforce when running closely behind another car, and ensure that the front wheel wake is well controlled and directed down the car in the least disruptive way.

That means not sending the wake dramatically outboard, as is done on the current cars, nor letting it spill under the floor and get ingested by the diffuser, but instead steering it narrowly down the side of the car as much as possible.

5. An aero feature from the 70s is back!

F1's Motorsports team began work on the 2022 car back in 2017 - and it soon became apparent that the key change required to ensure closer racing would be placing the aerodynamic emphasis on ground effect to create downforce.

Ground effect came to prominence in F1 in the late 1970s, with cars effectively designed in the shape of upside-down airplane wings, creating huge amounts of downforce as they were pushed into the track.

Full ground effect cars were subsequently outlawed at the end of 1982 - and the 2022 car is certainly not a return to that era (there are no side skirts for a start!). But the 2022 car does feature fully shaped underfloor tunnels, rather than the stepped floor used currently, which will allow teams to generate large amounts of efficient downforce through ground effect (the current floors also exploit ground effect, but not to the same extent).

The reason for the change is the benign quality of downforce generated in ground effect. Current cars' barge boards and other bits of aerodynamic furniture are designed to send vortices under the floor to increase downforce. But when those vortices stop working - due, for example, to the influence of closely following another car - the performance drop-off is huge.

With the 2022 car, however, the underfloor downforce is better preserved within the tunnels, without the reliance on arrays of wake-sensitive, vortex-generating geometries - ergo better following, ergo closer racing!

6. The rear wing features new 'rolled tips'

While current cars' rear wings direct airflow upwards, they are also designed to send flow outwards, leaving the 'dirty air' sitting there for the following car to drive through. By contrast, the shape and position of the 2022 car's rear wing creates a rotational airflow that collects the rear wheel wake and rolls it into the flow exiting the diffuser - forming an invisible 'mushroom'-shaped wake.

This narrower wake is then thrown - thanks also to a steeper diffuser ramp - high up into the air, allowing a following car to drive through less disrupted 'clean air'.

DRS remains on the rear wing, meanwhile, with the Motorsports team keen to study its effect in conjunction with the rule changes.

7. Power unit remains the same as 2021

Many things are new on the 2022 car - but the power unit is not one of them, with Formula 1 set to retain the current 1.6-litre turbo-hybrid units. This is no bad thing, given that they're already the most advanced and most efficient engines on the planet.

There will, however, be some more standard components in the fuel system, as well as some additional sensors to allow the FIA to better monitor the power units.

8. Cars will run on more sustainable fuel

Current regulations see cars running on fuel containing 5.75% bio-components. And while F1 is still working hard to introduce fully sustainable fuel in the near-future, 2022 will see the bio-component ratio rise to 10%. That will be achieved through a move to 'E10 fuel' - 'E' standing for ethanol, while '10' refers to its percentage in the mixture.

Crucially, though, that ethanol must be a second-generation biofuel made in a sustainable way, meaning it will have a near-zero carbon footprint - an "interim step", in the words of Formula 1's Chief Technical Officer Pat Symonds, which will also help the sport align with current road car fuel regulations.

9. Safety has been at the forefront of the design

It almost goes without saying that a new generation of Formula 1 cars comes with the opportunity to make the sport even safer - and that's certainly the case with the 2022 car.

The chassis now needs to absorb 48% and 15% more energy respectively in the front and rear impact tests, as well as greater forces in the static 'squeeze' tests required to homologate the chassis and certify their strength.

Lessons have been learned, too, from recent major crashes, including that of Romain Grosjean at the 2020 Bahrain Grand Prix - with the cars now designed in such a way that, in the event of a crash, the power unit will separate from the chassis in a safe manner without exposing the fuel tank.

Meanwhile, learnings from the FIA's investigation into Formula 2 racer Anthoine Hubert's fatal accident at Spa in 2019 were also incorporated, principally a longer nose section to help dissipate energy in a crash, together with stronger chassis sides to resist T-bone incidents.

It's also true that those safety improvements, as well as the heavier and more robust tyres, have seen a weight increase, with the minimum car weight having risen by around 5% from 752kg currently to 790kg.

10. The 2022 car has been put through over 7,500 simulations to get to this point F1 is nothing if not a thorough sport - and as you can imagine, creating the 2022 car has not been a 'finger in the air' exercise.

Instead, F1's Motorsports team have run approximately 7,500 simulations, creating around half a petabyte of data. That's the equivalent of a third of the 10 billion photos on Facebook, or 10 million four-drawer filing cabinets full of text documents.

Those 7,500 simulations also took 16.5 million core hours to solve, meaning if they'd been done on a high-spec Intel i9 quad core laptop, it would have taken until the year 2492 - 471 years from now - to get the solutions.

The 2022 car was also developed in exclusive sessions in Sauber's wind tunnel in Switzerland, with 138 'baseline configurations' experimented with over two years, with around 100 'wind on' hours.

Meanwhile, the teams have also been granted regulatory freedom to test the current 2022 car iteration - or the 'UNIFORM' baseline as it's known internally, given that it's the 21st significant update - for methodology development in their wind tunnels and CFD (provided they don't alter the shape), with the feedback from the teams having been a crucial part of the design and development process.

Bonus points

The driver who records the fastest lap of the race will get one bonus point. However, the driver must also finish in the top 10 in order to qualify for the point. This is to stop all the drivers outside the top 10 pitting for fresh tyres in the last few laps in an effort to set a fastest lap, which would compromise the integrity of the race.

Sprint Events

Following last years' introduction of the Sprint Qualifying format, the F1 Commission has again approved plans to run the Sprint format at three Grands Prix weekends at Imola, the Red Bull Ring and Interlagos, in 2022. Following talks with all the key stakeholders, including governing body the FIA and all teams, an agreement has been reached to hold events at the Emilia Romagna, Austrian and Sao Paulo Grands Prix.

The points system has been tweaked, with the top eight drivers scoring points; previously it was just the top three finishers who received points. It's now more lucrative: the driver who finishes P1 will receive eight points, down to one point for the driver in P8.

It has also been decided that the driver who sets the fastest time in qualifying - which on Sprint weekends will take place on Friday - will be attributed 'pole position.' Last year, it was the driver who won the Sprint who earned that accolade.

Qualifying will continue to determine the grid for Saturday's F1 Sprint, with the result of the Sprint forming the line-up for the start of Sunday's Grand Prix.

The drivers' and constructors' championship titles are awarded to the driver and constructor who score the most points over the course of the season.

Half points

If a race is suspended and cannot be resumed, points for each title will be awared in accordance with the following criteria:

- No points will be awarded if the leader has completed less than two laps
- No points will be awarded unless a minimum of two laps have been completed by the leader without a Safety Car and/or VSC intervention
- If the leader has completed two laps but less than 25% of the scheduled race distance, points will be awarded in accordance with column 1 of the table below
- If the leader has completed 25% but less than 50% of the scheduled race distance, points will be awarded in accordance with column 2 of the table below
- If the leader has completed 50% but less thank 75% of the scheduled race distance, points will be awarded in accordance with column 3 of the table below
- If the leader has completed 75% or more of the scheduled race distance, full points will be awarded



The Bahrain International Circuit has established itself as a popular host for world-class motor sport. Professional facilities and experienced staff have paved the way for numerous international race series to utilize the circuit, including Formula 2/ Formula 3 Championship and Porsche Sprint Challenge Middle East.

You can usually expect great racing and decent amounts of overtaking in Bahrain, while the drivers have to contend with wind, racing under floodlights and the difficulty of finding a decent set-up with the wide temperature fluctuations between sessions. The track's most challenging point is the tight, downhill, off-camber Turn 10 left-hander, while the fast run through Turn 12 is another highlight, allowing the racers to really feel their cars coming alive.



The inaugural Saudi Arabian Grand Prix took place in 2021, the race joining its Middle Eastern counterparts in Bahrain and Abu Dhabi - while like those races, the Saudi Arabian Grand Prix also takes place under floodlights.

The circuit is fast. Very fast. Average speeds around the Jeddah Corniche Circuit are around 250km/h - quicker than those at Silverstone, and second on the 2021 calendar only to Monza - aka 'The Temple of Speed'. It is, quite simply, the fastest street circuit ever seen in Formula 1 - while the track also features the most corners on the calendar with 27, many of them quick, sinuous bends as the drivers wend their way along the Jeddah waterfront.





Due to the Covid-19 travel restrictions over the past couple of years and to the delight of Formula 1 fans worldwide, Melbourne has finally re-joined the Formula 1 calendar.

As a temporary facility, Albert Park can be quite bumpy, while the circuit at the start of the weekend is often slippery, rubbering in as the sessions progress. It's also a circuit that requires a well-sorted chassis, with several spots on the track where the drivers require a reactive front end to allow them to chuck it into a corner - the main one being the rapid Turn 11-12 chicane. Melbourne is also one of the faster tracks on the calendar, with Lewis Hamilton's 2019 pole lap set at an average of over 235km/h.



Imola had its foundation stone laid in March 1950. It was ready for testing by October 1952, while racing began at the circuit in 1953. The track was first awarded the honour of hosting the Italian Grand Prix in 1980. From 1981, Imola was taking on its famous 'San Marino' title and going on to host a total of 27 Grand Prix up until 2006. Imola returned to the F1 calendar amid the Covid-19 changes of 2020 and only recently signed a contract until 2025.

The circuit offers a thrill ride. After testing his AlphaTauri ATO1 at the track in the build-up to the 2020 season, Pierre Gasly called the experience one of the best he'd ever had in a Formula 1 car, while his then-team mate Daniil Kvyat remarked that "an F1 car through corners like Acque Minerali - the entrance is so fast, it's so cool. It really gives you a lot of adrenaline." The anti-clockwise circuit is certainly fast, with an old-school feel as the drivers put it on the line in iconic corners like the aforementioned Acque Minerali and Piratella.




Making its F1 debut in May 2022, the Miami International Autodrome is a temporary circuit, but one designed to have a permanent feel. Set in the Hard Rock Stadium complex in Miami Gardens, home to the NFL's famous Miami Dolphins franchise, the track is the culmination of a development process that simulated no less than 36 different layouts before settling on a thrilling, 19-turn lap that provides a street circuit vibe, not dissimilar to Melbourne's Albert Park.

The Florida race joining its Texan counterpart in Austin to become the second US race on the calendar - and the 11^{th} different American venue to host a round of the Formula 1 world championship.


The Circuit de Catalunya was built in 1989 through the efforts of a Consortium composed of the Catalan Government, the Reial Automòbil Club de Catalunya (RACC) and the Montmeló Town Council. In September 1991, the 35th Spanish F1 Grand Prix was held following a seventeen-year of absence in Catalonia. Today, the circuit is a familiar site for teams and drivers as the track is used for extensive offseason testing. The circuit underwent resurfacing and track modifications over last year's winter and is a good mix of high- and low-speed corners, with the challenging Turn 3 right-hander a great chance to evaluate the balance of the car.

The track offers plenty of choice for spectators with almost the whole track overlooked by grandstands or general admission areas. On the outside of Turn 1, Grandstand A will let you see the best overtaking spot on the track, while the general admission area around Turn 3 will provide the awe-inspiring sight of Formula 1 cars being pushed to the limit of their downforce capabilities.






The six kilometre, anti-clockwise layout of the circuit offers a mixture of wide and open straights as well as tight and twisty corners. The circuit starts with a long main straight along the Baku shoreline, then loop around Government House before heading west to Maiden Tower. Here, the track has a narrow uphill traversal and then circle the Old Town before opening up onto a 2.2 km (1.4 mi) stretch along Neftchilar Avenue back to the start line.




The fast, low-downforce circuit is one of the drivers' favourites. The track is quite stop-start, with lots of heavy-braking chicanes and the famous hairpin to get the anchors working hard. Out of the corners, though, the track is quick and flowing, while the most iconic piece of the circuit comes right at the end of the lap: the Wall of Champions, so-called after excursions into it from Damon Hill, Jacques Villeneuve and Michael Schumacher during the 1999 Canadian Grand Prix weekend.


Silverstone was the first Grand Prix, hosting the inaugural Formula 1 World Championship round on May 13th, 1950. Since it continues to be a top draw for fans of Formula 1, offering a rich tradition of racing, a fast and challenging track, as well as the constant prospect of weather playing a critical role in race day strategy. It's hard to stop the goose bumps from prickling as you walk around one of the great cathedrals of motorsport, while in terms of atmosphere, the British fans are always reliably raucous.

At the 2018 British Grand Prix, Lewis Hamilton compared a flat-out lap around Silverstone to flying a fighter jet, which should tell you all you need to know about the Northamptonshire circuit. Despite numerous layout changes over the years, Silverstone has always maintained its essential character as one of the fastest tracks on the F1 calendar, while historic corners like Maggotts, Becketts and Abbey provide some of the biggest challenges for racing drivers anywhere in the world.




The Red Bull Ring packs a lot into a short lap. The first half rewards power, as the cars blast along three straights separated by a pair of uphill right-handers. But then as the drivers work their way downhill, the circuit becomes a regular toboggan ride, as the cars canyon through a series of quick corners, including the exhilarating Rindt right-hander, named for Austria's first F1 champion.


The Circuit Paul Ricard's even distribution of high-, medium- and low-speed corners is a key reason why it's one of the most used test circuits in the world (the typically good weather is another). F1 drivers love the 290km/h right-hander at Signes and the 5g joyride of the following Beausset bend, while the circuit's 2018 return to the F1 calendar showed that the French Grand Prix track is a bit of an overtaking gem.

The Chicane series of grandstands put you at the best overtaking point on the track, while if you want to be closer to the fun and friendly Paul Ricard paddock, bag seats in the Virage du Pont stands to watch cars making their way through the final corner before blasting away down the main straight.




Home of the first Grand Prix to have been held behind the "Iron Curtain", The Hungaroring was built in record time and remains today a major attraction in Hungary. Held in the summer, the circuit is built in a natural bowl allowing excellent vantage points for spectators. That means that any of the grandstands located on or around the main straight should provide a view of other parts of the track too.

The lack of straights at the Hungaroring often sees it compared to a karting circuit - and it's true, the resemblance is uncanny. With several series of corners to string together, teams opt for Monaco levels of downforce, with a well-sorted chassis tending to be rewarded over horsepower given the short straights on offer. It's a challenge many of the drivers relish, however, with finding a good rhythm key to setting fast lap times.


The Circuit de Spa-Francorchamps is legendary among race enthusiasts for its long-standing history and unique setting. It is considered one of the most challenging tracks in the world, mainly due to its fast, hilly, and twisty layout within the Ardennes Forest. The size of the track and the nature of Belgian weather means it can sometimes be raining on one part of the track and dry on another, meaning grip can vary from one corner to the next.

Spa is among Formula 1 drivers' most loved tracks, with its mix of long straights and challenging fast corners allowing them to push their cars to the edge of their capabilities - if it's dry, that is. The size of the track and the nature of Belgian weather means it can sometimes be raining on one part of the track and dry on another, meaning grip can vary from one corner to the next. Keep an eye on the thrilling Eau Rouge, arguably the most famous sequence of corners in the world, as the drivers flick left, right, and then up the hill through Raidillon.


Zandvoort was first opened in 1948, part of the wave of post-war motorsport enthusiasm that swept across Europe. Originally made up of a mixture of permanent track and public roads that snaked through the sand dunes of the Zandvoort resort town, the Dutch Automobile Racing Club - who initiated the plans for the circuit - brought in 1927 Le Mans winner Sammy Davis to consult on the layout for the original 4.2km track.

The current F1 drivers describe the track 'really quick', 'pretty insane', 'crazy' and 'old-school' that many of them tackled in their junior category days. We'd also add 'undulating' to that list. The Zandvoort track swoops and flows through the sand dunes, creating a rollercoaster-like feel to the lap.


Constructed in just 110 days in 1922, the Autodromo Nazionale Monza was the world's third purpose-built racetrack, coming after Brooklands in the UK and Indianapolis in the US. Monza opened its doors on September 3, 1922, just a week before it hosted that year's Italian Grand Prix. It was then part of the original Formula 1 calendar in 1950 and has held the Italian Grand Prix every year bar one since.

Formula 1's fastest ever lap was set at Monza - William's driver Juan Pablo Montoya's 260.6km/h effort during practice for the 2004 Grand Prix - which should give you some idea of the nature of the track the locals call 'La Pista Magica'. Cars are on full throttle for 80% of the lap and hit their Vmax on the circuit's 1.1km start/finish straight. From there, they roar off into the historic park section, where a series of big stops into tight chicanes give the brakes a good workout.




In 2008, Singapore had the honour of hosting the first night-time race in F1 history. The Grand Prix - the 15th round of that season - proved a huge hit with the teams and drivers, while Renault's Fernando Alonso claimed a controversial victory.

The 5.063km Marina Bay Circuit is one of the most physically demanding on the calendar, its bumpy street surface coupled with humid conditions giving the drivers plenty to think about. With 23 corners, they are working the wheel a lot, too, around the high-speed lap - the physical stress causing them to lose as much as 3kg over the course of a race. The circuit also boasts some of the most unique features of any track on the F1 calendar, including Turn 18, which actually sees the drivers pass underneath a grandstand.




Designed as a Honda test track in 1962, the circuit is another of the racer's favourite, featuring some of the most challenging corners. Among the most popular are the high-speed 130R and the famous Spoon Curve. Its "figure-of-eight" layout also makes the track unique in F1 racing, where the back straight passes over the front via an overpass.


The Circuit of The Americas, designed by Hermann Tilke in collaboration with American architectural firm HKS, endured something of a nervy start, with construction suffering several setbacks. It was well worth the wait, though, when 1978 F1 champion Mario Andretti opened the track on October 21 2012.

If the corners at COTA seem familiar, they should be. Turns 3 through 6 look not dissimilar to Silverstone's high-speed run through Maggotts/Becketts or the S Curves at Suzuka, while Turns 12 through 15 mimic Hockenheim's stadium section. Meanwhile, the uphill run into wide, wide Turn 1 - hey, everything's bigger in Texas, right? - has provided some fine overtaking action in the track's short life.

In 1959, the father of Mexico's most famous racing brothers, Ricardo and Pedro Rodriguez, was an advisor to Mexican President Adolfo Lopez Mateo, and had a word in his boss's ear about building a racing circuit in Mexico City's Magdalena Mixiuhca sports park using the existing internal roads. El Presidente liked the idea, and work on the track was completed in under a year.


The racetrack is located over 2,200m above sea level, which makes it the highest altitude venue on the F1 calendar. The thin air at this altitude presents a unique challenge for cars and drivers.

To put it in perspective, Brazil's Interlagos, the second-highest race location, is at around 800m above sea level.


Building work began on what ended up being called the Autodromo Jose Carlos Pace - but what is more commonly referred to as Interlagos - all the way back in 1938. The track designers took their inspiration from three main circuits: Brooklands in the UK, Roosevelt Raceway in the USA and Montlhery in France.

Buoyed by the success of Brazil's Emerson Fittipaldi, Formula 1 first jetted into Interlagos for a world championship race in 1973. Fans were treated to a home win in the first three Brazilian Grands Prix, with Fittipaldi victorious in 1973 and 1974, while Carlos Pace won in 1975.

The Hermann Tilke-designed track, inaugurated in 2009 and located on Yas Island is Formula One's first ever day-night race, starting in the afternoon and finishing after sunset. Floodlights are activated from the start of the race to provide a transition into the evening.

The circuit is dominated by its 1.2km straight between Turns 7 and 8 - which, with slow-speed corners marking its beginning and end, makes it a honeypot for overtaking moves. Other highlights include the tricky run through Turns 15 and 16 into 17, which forces the drivers to brake hard with bags of lateral load still on the car.

6. SUPPORT RACES 6.1. W SERIES

INTRODUCTION

W Series drivers are selected purely on their ability and the series' cars are mechanically identical, which means that W Series races and championships will be won by the most talented drivers, rather than those with the wealthiest backers.

We want to build the world's most popular and inclusive female sporting series that inspires and empowers females to be a part of motorsport on equal terms with men. In the process, we hope to create a platform to accelerate gender equality the world over.

We want to see women from all over the world racing in the upper echelons of motorsport, including in F1.

We want acceptance that female and male racing drivers can compete with one another on equal terms, when given the same opportunities.

6.2. PORSCHE SPRINT CHALLENGE NORTH AMERICA BY YOKOHAMA

INTRODUCTION

The Porsche Sprint Challenge North America by Yokohama moves into its second season with great momentum. The Porsche Motorsport Pyramid North America series will have access to the newest Porsche 911 GT3 Cup race car, the type 992, for its top class and a strong eight-race schedule developed to minimize conflicts with other major sports car racing events. The schedule enjoys multiple high-visibility events including the Grand Prix of Miami and Porsche Sports Car Together Fest at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway.

Unveiled in October 2020 and running its first race at Sebring International Raceway in March 2021, the Porsche Sprint Challenge North America is the first one-make racing step on the Motorsport Pyramid, a tier below the premier single-brand Porsche Carrera Cup North America Presented by the Cayman Islands. With the goal of moving drivers, teams and corporate partners from club level racing to a more professional and competitive environment, the series plays an intricate role in the growth and development of Porsche Motorsport. Buoyed by the success and positive impact of the championship, Yokohama Tire will remain as the sole tire partner and supplier to both the Porsche Sprint Challenge North America by Yokohama and the Porsche Sprint Challenge USA West by Yokohama.

Beginning in 2022, the Porsche Sprint Challenge North America by Yokohama added the Porsche 911 GT3 Cup, type 992 to its top "992" class. The 510-horsepower, rearengine race car, based on the Porsche 911 GT3 road car, made its international debut in the Porsche Carrera Cup North America Presented by the Cayman Islands, and was used exclusively in the top two classes (Pro and Pro-Am) of that championship in its first year.

The type 992 is now be made available for participation in the Sprint Challenge running in 992 class events against the Porsche 911 GT3 Cup type 991.2 in the 991 class.

Traction Control (TC) will be made exclusively available to all drivers competing with the Porsche 911 GT3 Cup type 992 in the Porsche Sprint Challenge North America and Porsche Sprint Challenge USA West. This comes in addition to the use of anti-lock braking (ABS) already available on all type 992 Porsche 911 GT3 Cup race cars. TC will be added to the driver aid package for Sprint Challenge competitors and not homologated into the Porsche Carrera Cup North America. This further differentiates the two series while also highlighting the professional nature of the Carrera Cup.

Yokohama Returns as Sole Tire Partner.

Yokohama Tire has been a longtime one-make partner with Porsche Motorsport North America. Following the success of the Porsche Sprint Challenge North America in 2021, the Japanese tire company continues in its key role as tire and marketing partner to the USAC-managed championship in 2022. In addition to being the sole supplier of racing tires - both slick and rain tires - to the second-year Sprint Challenge North America, Yokohama will also be the exclusive fitment to the new Porsche Sprint Challenge USA West by Yohohama.



The United States Auto Club (USAC) is the managing body for Porsche Sprint Challenge North America. USAC is one of the leading motorsports organizations on the continent with oversight on many racing series fronts including sports cars, open wheel, circle track, rally, off-road, snowmobile, karting and youth racing in its portfolio. While widely known as the pinnacle short-track and dirt racing series in the country, USAC previously conducted the United States Road Racing Championship from 1958 - 1962 and made its return to road racing with the Porsche Sprint Challenge in 2021.
