

JEDDAH SIGHTS & ATTRACTIONS - OVERVIEW

#### **Tourism**

#### Al Balad

Discover the Kingdom's most evocative historical quarter, which is also listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site.



It is one of the most unique and charming places, offering visitors a distinctive impression of its architecture and Saudi Arabia's rich history and cultural heritage.

It holds eight gates which challenge different historical factors and holds over 10 ancient houses praised for their distinctive designs and ancient families including Bait Nassif, Bait Matbouli and Bait Nour Wali.

# King Fahd's Fountain

Visible from across the city, this much-loved 30-year-old local monument is located in the middle of the Red Sea. Standing at 312 meters high, the fountain reflects the sunset of Jeddah, giving an impression of close proximity. It is also the world's tallest fountain.



# **Tayebat Museum**

Visit for a fascinating look into Jeddah's cosmopolitan past.



As one of the Gulf's oldest seaports and the gateway to the holy city of Makkah, Jeddah has a long and cosmopolitan past. Tayebat Museum is a superb representation of the city's 2500-year history. Housed in a multiroom complex, the museum has re-created the traditional Hijazi architecture of the old city and offers a living lesson on the foundation of Jeddah and the wider Arabian Peninsula.

#### Sougs of Jeddah

Explore the nooks and alleyways of local shops, offering traditional antique goods as well as latest trends in a pulsing and vibrant area.



#### Fakieh Aquarium

Come face-to-face with some of the Red Sea's oddities.



This exhibition boasts sprawling tunnels and vast tanks to house over 200 species, with 85% native to Jeddah's undisturbed coral reefs. Located on Jeddah's North Corniche, Fakieh Aquarium is Saudi Arabia's first marine exhibition. Its meditative soundtrack and closed cavern walls bring you face-to-face with some of the 800 Red Sea oddities that don't exist anywhere else.

#### Jeddah Park

Located on Prince Muhammad Bin Abdulaziz Street near the Hotel Galleria By Elaf, Jeddah Park is one of the newest and largest shopping and entertainment centers in Jeddah, and a one-stop destination for a great shopping experience.



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BEST MUSEUMS IN JEDDAH

#### **Nassif House Museum**

Built in the late 1800s for then-governor of Jeddah, Sheikh Omar Effendi Nassif, the Nassif House Museum is the site of various historical activities, even serving as the temporary royal residence of King Abdulaziz, the founder of the modern Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, in 1925. Located in the UNESCO World Heritage Site of Al Balad, the mansion went from exemplifying Jeddah's elite to becoming a cultural center for all.

#### Matbouli House Museum

Full of oddities, the Historic District of Jeddah is home to several old houses. As one of Al Balad's more curious spaces, the 400-year-old Al Matbouli House allows you to experience local life at the turn of the century. From how the city's residents dined to the various traditions of hospitality, the place offers a great insight into the values and customs of those who once dwelled in this historic neighbourhood.

#### **Tayebat City Museum**

The museum spans several buildings, all constructed using elements of traditional Hijazi architecture. Today, Tayebat City Museum is by far one of the most popular museums in the city, housing a prized collection of pre-Islamic-era pieces. There's also a charming little mosque within the premises, which is a work of art in and of itself. If you fall in love with antiquities after your visit, then you can buy some at one of the many antique shops that line the façade of the museum.

#### Museum of Abdul Rauf Khalil

Tucked away in a plush neighbourhood that houses modern concrete buildings, the Abdul Rauf Khalil Museum stands out like a sore thumb, with its exquisite rawasheen (latticed windows), arched galleries, and ornate doors. On the inside, expect Abbasid era coins, rare manuscripts of the Quran, and an assortment of objects d'art.

We recommend the fahsa – slow-cooked marinated meat that's buttery and tender. All orders are served with malawah-style buttery layered bread. As for dessert, try the deliciously calorific marsa, which is a mix of bananas, dried bread, honey, and cream.

#### ALCOHOL & SUBSTANCES

The sale, purchase, and consumption of alcohol and drugs is illegal in Saudi Arabia.

#### CURRENCY

The national currency of Saudi Arabia is the Saudi Riyal (SR) and is managed by the Saudi Central Bank. The SAR is made up of 100 halala, and is often presented with the symbol SR. The SAR is currently pegged:

- to the U.S. Dollar at about 3.75 SAR
- to the Euro at about 4.05 SAR
- to the British £ at about 4.84 SAR

One SR is subdivided into 100 halala. You will receive notes in denominations of five riyals, ten riyals, 50 riyals, 100 riyals and 500 riyals; and coins in one riyal, two riyals, 50 halala, 25 halala, 10 halala, 5 halala and 1 halala.

# DRESS CODE

The dress code is dependent on individual establishments, some casual, others keen on sophistication. Places of worship specifically do require you to dress modestly while visiting.

#### ELECTRICITY

Standard electrical power in Saudi Arabia is 230V supply voltage and 60 Hz. The associated plug is type G, which is the plug that has three rectangular pins in a triangular pattern.

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



Seven rule changes for the 2025 season – From fastest lap to increased rookie running.

# 1. Removal of the fastest lap point

Since 2019, a driver finishing in the top 10 could earn a bonus point by setting the fastest lap of the race. Sometimes that meant drivers would still be pushing late on trying to take the accolade, or even make late pit stops for fresh rubber to increase their return.

But it also opened up the possibility for a car outside the top 10 to pit and take the point away from another driver, even if they weren't going to score themselves. And with the bonus sometimes proving a controversial topic, the decision was taken to remove it from the scoring system this year.

The rest of the points system remains unchanged, with the top 10 drivers scoring in a Grand Prix, and the top eight in a sprint.

# 2. Driver cooling systems

If a weather forecast predicts temperatures of 31C or above at some time during a Sprint or Grand Prix, a Heat Hazard can be declared. Teams will subsequently be notified by the FIA of the declaration and will be required to fit a mandated driver cooling system.

This, in turn, leads to an increase in the weight limit of the cars with two different limits applied – an additional 2kg for practice, Qualifying and Sprint Qualifying sessions, but a total of +5kg for a Sprint or Grand Prix.

The two different weight limits are in place to allow teams to fit the base system to ease workloads, but without needing to fill it with cooling fluid — as it is not considered necessary to mandate use of the system in a practice or qualifying type session due to the shorter run nature of these sessions.

A driver cooling system is "defined as a system, the sole purpose of which, is to provide additional cooling for the drier," and is set to be delivered in the form of a fireproof shirt that allows a fluid to be pumped around a series of tubes. It also includes a pump, plumbing and a thermal store to generate the cooling (such as an ice block).

### 3. Limits to race drivers testing old cars

A year ago, there was a tweak to the Testing of Previous Car (TPC) regulations as teams had to use components that had run during a race weekend at least once. This time around, the changes relate to the drivers getting behind the wheel.

While teams can carry out up to a maximum of 20 days of TPC running in any given calendar year, their race drivers are only allowed to take part in four such days, during which they are not allowed to exceed 1000km of running in total.

The restriction only relates to TPC track time — using a car that is at least two seasons old — and not tyre testing or promotional running with current machinery.

Teams are also only allowed to have one TPC car available to run during a test at any one time.

#### 4. More running for rookies

The mandatory FP1 running for rookie drivers has been expanded for 2025, ensuring double the amount of track time during a race weekend for those who have participated in no more than two F1 races in their career.

Teams have had to run a rookie at least once in each of their cars — so on two occasions total — each season since 2022, but as of this year that number increases to twice per car. So, with each team made up of two cars, that means four occasions during the year when they will run an inexperienced driver for the first practice session of a weekend.

#### 5. Tighter restrictions on DRS designs and wing deflections

The FIA has tightened up the technical regulations surrounding the rear wing and DRS (Drag Reduction System), with the main changes focusing on defining the state of deployment and restriction to only two positions (closed and open).

This has been brought in to close off "mini-DRS" concepts — where the top elements of a rear wing tilt backwards at speed to reduce drag.

There will also be more stringent testing of the rear wing slot gap to limit how much deflection is acceptable, up from an applied load of 10 newtons to 30 newtons.

Other related areas that are still pending approval by the F1 Commission include a new deflection limit on the upper rear wing, to reduce the gap allowed between the rear wing profiles and the rear wing tips. Similarly, stricter limits on front wing deflection limits to be introduced from Round 9 (Barcelona) onwards are still to be approved.

# 6. Tweaks to qualifying classifications

Last year's São Paulo Grand Prix raised the possibility of qualifying not being possible due to the weather, and it has now been written into the regulations that, as long as the stewards accept that a qualifying session can't take place, the grid for the race will be defined based upon the Drivers' Championship classification.

The same applies for a Sprint Qualifying session not being able to take place. In both cases, if the Drivers' Championship order can't be used (such as the first round of the season) then a grid order will be decided at the stewards' discretion.

The way a qualifying classification will be reached in the event of multiple drivers failing to set a time in Q2 or Q3 (or SQ2 or SQ3) has also been clarified.

While drivers will continue to be ordered based on whether they started a flying lap, ahead of those who left the pits to make an attempt, if there are any drivers who don't set a lap time and can't be separated by those metrics, then the order from the previous segment of the session will be used.

As an example, if two drivers start flying laps in Q3 but fail to complete them due to a red flag and don't set a time, then they will be classified in the order based on who was fastest between them in Q2.

# 7. A mule car tyre test

The end-of-season test in Abu Dhabi will take on a slightly different form this year, due to the major change in regulations that will come into force in 2026.

While the Young Driver Test will run as usual — with a current car being used by a driver who has started no more than two Grand Prix — the second car has to be a mule car that is adapted for the purpose of testing the 2026 tyres.

Those tyres will be of a different dimension and specification to the 2025 Pirelli rubber, and the expected performance characteristics of the next generation of cars will also differ, so teams can use either their 2025 car, or any car falling within the previous four years, that has been "suitably modified for the purpose of providing the appointed tyre supplier with a means of track testing of its future products."

### **Sprint Events**

The F1 Sprint returns for a fifth season in 2025, and fans will again see six F1 Sprint events, in: Shanghai, Miami, Spa, Austin, São Paulo and Lusail.

A Formula 1 weekend is usually run (though not always) over Friday, Saturday and Sunday. Over the three days, the F1 cars appear on track for five sessions. A standard weekend has three Free Practice sessions (FP1, FP2 and FP3) lasting an hour each, another hour for Qualifying – which sets the grid for the Grand Prix – and then the Grand Prix itself.

On a Sprint weekend, two of the practice sessions are deleted and replaced. A Sprint Qualifying session sets the grid for the Sprint – that replaces FP2 on a Friday afternoon. The Sprint itself replaces FP3 on Saturday, before Qualifying for the Grand Prix happens as normal in the afternoon.

With limited Free Practice running the pressure is on to get the set-up right first time, and with extra points available in a Sprint weekend it's even more intense.

The top eight finishers in each Sprint race score points, with eight points rewarded for 1st place, 7 for 2nd place, six for 3rd place and so on.

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# POINTS & CLASSIFICATION, SPRINT EVENTS\*

The F1 Sprint has consistently proven its popularity since its introduction in 2021, with the format delivering strong numbers across all traditional broadcast, digital and social platforms, as well as providing extra and exciting racing that promoters can offer to the fans and bringing large attendances on the Friday of a Sprint weekend.

So far in 2024, live audience figures for Sprint Qualifying and the Sprint race at the Chinese Grand Prix were up 40% across the top 15 markets compared to the average practice sessions for the opening two races.

The live broadcast of the Sprint in Miami drew in 946,000 viewers on ESPN, making it the largest ever US audience for a Sprint since the format was introduced in 2021, and in Austria this year, live viewership of Sprint Qualifying was up 76% versus the FP2 sessions in the last two European races.

Stefano Domenicali, President and CEO of Formula 1, said: "The Sprint has been a great success for Formula 1, bringing all our fans more action and racing on the track. We are seeing the proof of this in our audience data, fan attendance on Fridays and from the promoters and partners.

"As we prepare to celebrate our 75th anniversary in 2025 we will always celebrate our incredible history, but we must always be looking ahead, innovating, and improving to deliver the best for our growing and diverse fanbase."

"The Sprint is a great example of bringing new elements to our sport in a way that is respectful of the Championship, and I want to thank the six venues that will host the Sprint in 2025 and look forward to those incredible events throughout the season."

Mohammed Ben Sulayem, President of the FIA, added: "As the FIA Formula One World Championship celebrates its 75th anniversary in 2025, the Sprint will also enter its fifth year as part of the competition.

"Over that time, and through our strong collaboration with Formula 1 and with the input of all the teams, it has been through several different iterations and the regulations and format have evolved to give us the exciting and popular Sprints we have today.

"The six events for 2025 once again take in an interesting range of circuits and are sure to provide fans with plenty of additional action across the season."

The anti-clockwise circuit is certainly fast, with an old-school feel as the drivers put it on the line in iconic corners like the aforementioned Acque Minerali and Piratella.

It's a challenge many of the drivers' relish, however, with finding a good rhythm key to setting fast lap times.



Formula 1's fastest ever lap was set at Monza – William's driver Juan Pablo Montoya's 260.6km/h effort during practice for the 2004 Grand Prix – which should give you some idea of the nature of the track the locals call 'La Pista Magica'. Cars are on full throttle for 80% of the lap and hit their Vmax on the circuit's 1.1km start/finish straight. From there, they roar off into the historic park section, where a series of big stops into tight chicanes give the brakes a good workout.





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

Meanwhile, the uphill run into wide, wide Turn 1 – hey, everything's bigger in Texas, right? – has provided some fine overtaking action in the track's short life.



In 1959, the father of Mexico's most famous racing brothers, Ricardo and Pedro Rodriguez, was an advisor to Mexican President Adolfo Lopez Mateo, and had a word in his boss's ear about building a racing circuit in Mexico City's Magdalena Mixiuhca sports park using the existing internal roads. El Presidente liked the idea, and work on the track was completed in under a year.

The racetrack is located over 2,200m above sea level, which makes it the highest altitude venue on the F1 calendar. The thin air at this altitude presents a unique challenge for cars and drivers. The track largely follows the outline of the original 1959 circuit, the main difference being that the spectacularly scary Peralta corner is now bisected, with the circuit instead winding through the old Foro Sol baseball stadium, providing one F1's most unique vistas.



Building work began on what ended up being called the Autodromo Jose Carlos Pace – but what is more commonly referred to as Interlagos – all the way back in 1938. The track designers took their inspiration from three main circuits: Brooklands in the UK, Roosevelt Raceway in the USA and Montlhery in France.

Buoyed by the success of Brazil's Emerson Fittipaldi, Formula 1 first jetted into Interlagos for a World Championship race in 1973. Fans were treated to a home win in the first three Brazilian Grands Prix, with Fittipaldi victorious in 1973 and 1974, while Carlos Pace won in 1975.

Brazil's Interlagos racetrack is at around 800m above sea level, the second-highest race location after Mexico-City.



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



The Hermann Tilke-designed track, inaugurated in 2009 and located on Yas Island is Formula 1's first ever day-night race, starting in the afternoon and finishing after sunset. Floodlights are activated from the start of the race to provide a transition into the evening.

The circuit is dominated by its 1.2km straight between turns 5 and 6 – which, with slow-speed corners marking its beginning and end, makes it a honeypot for overtaking moves. Other highlights include the tricky run through turns 10 into 12, which forces the drivers to brake hard with bags of lateral load still on the car.

This, along with further relationships with a host of committed suppliers, has enabled us to create a category that is technologically advanced, ultra-competitive, whilst controlling the costs.

The Championship benefits from the experience of the FIA who oversees the running of all on-track events, while F1's unparalleled expertise in broadcasting and marketing ensures that the F2 Championship has a truly global reach and appeal.

#### **SAFETY & VALUES**

**Safety -** Racing at speeds very close to F1, safety is of paramount importance to F2. The car has been designed to strict F1 safety standards and submitted to stringent FIA crash tests. Our cars include the Titanium Halo head protection system used in F1 and anti-intrusion panels, while wearing the HANS device is compulsory for drivers. The Championship puts its commitment to safety ahead of all other considerations.

**Preparation -** Since its inception, Formula 2's mission statement has been to prepare the best up and coming young drivers for the pinnacle of motorsport, Formula 1. With every step, these aspiring drivers must develop skills that are key on the road to F1, in equal technologically advanced cars, while racing in front of the F1 paddock and fans.

During their time in the Championship, they must learn the F1 tracks, how to manage the Pirelli tyres, DRS, the Virtual Safety Car system, the marshalling systems, and race control, while having limited track time, longer races, pit stops and tyre strategies to contend with and a specific weekend format, all under immense pressure to deliver in a highly competitive category.

**Sustainability & Diversity -** Formula 2 plays a significant pioneering role in the advancements of technology in motorsport. In 2023, the Championship, along with its sister category Formula 3, began a successful multi-step switch to using global F1 partner Aramco's advanced fuels with an eye towards being compliant with the FIA 100% sustainable fuel standard. This important innovation is also a key part of a wider sustainability plan that also includes using recycled carbon fibre parts on the new F3 car.

Both F2 and F3 have also been working for quite some time to make both categories more diverse, most notably designing cars that are suitable for a wide range of drivers, keeping in mind that one of the goals is to see female drivers be competitive on both grids.

**Performance -** F2 is the only junior Formula in the world which can get close to the performance levels of Formula 1, thanks to our turbocharged engines, which produce 620bhp. It means our cars can go from 0-100 km/h in 2.90 seconds and can reach a maximum speed of 335 km/h.

Cost Control – The series wants to produce drivers who are readymade for F1. To achieve this, the series needs the fastest and most competitive young racers on the planet, regardless of any financial restrictions they may have. This makes cost effectiveness key. Operating at around 2% of the cost of running an F1 team, Formula 2 are always trying to reach the perfect blend of budget control and performance.

This has been achieved by centralised purchasing, strict limits on team personnel and testing and an outright ban on individual development costs. Any modifications made are produced with an eye on how they will affect the price structure for the teams.

Entertainment - Formula 2 is part of the FIA Pyramid and the Formula One Group. As such, it makes for a clear path for drivers who dream of racing in Formula 1, but also, the Championship is essential to a Grand Prix weekend, providing the fans with enthralling racing. Entertainment is in the Championship's DNA: designing a car that is challenging to drive but also allows for close racing and overtaking opportunities. If you watch F2, you watch the future of F1, and you can expect the unexpected on track.

# **WEEKEND FORMAT & POINTS ALLOCATION**

On a Friday, there is one Free Practice session of 45 minutes and one Qualifying session of 30 minutes.

One Sprint Race will take place on Saturday and will consist of 120 kilometres or 45 minutes, whichever comes first (\*).

The Feature Race takes place on Sunday morning ahead of the Formula 1 Grand Prix and will consist of 170 kilometres or 60 minutes, whichever comes first (\*)

The Feature Race includes a compulsory pitstop in which all four tyres must be changed. Unless the driver has used wet-weather tyres during the Feature Race, they must use at least one set of each specification of dry-weather tyres during the Feature Race.

A schedule will be issued in the leadup to every round to determine timings of each session.

**Starting grids -** The results of the final classification of Friday's Qualifying session will determine the starting grid for Sunday's Feature Race. The starting grid of Saturday's Sprint Race will be determined by reversing the top 10 finishers of Friday's Qualifying session results.

**Points attribution -** Two points will be awarded to the driver who is shown in pole position for the Feature Race on the final grid issued.

For the Sprint Race, the top eight classified drivers will be awarded 10, 8, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2 and 1 points respectively. For the Feature Race, the top 10 finishers will score 25, 18, 15, 12, 10, 8, 6, 4, 2 and 1 points respectively.

In each race, one point will be awarded to the driver who achieves the fastest lap time, providing he was in the top 10 positions of the final race classification.

**Tyre allocation -** The sporting regulations state that each driver will be allocated five sets of dry-weather tyres per weekend. They will have three "prime" specification sets and two of the "option" specification. Each driver will also be provided with three sets of wet-weather tyres.

## DRS-

2025

- 1. The drivers are able to use the Drag Reduction System (DRS) as they wish within the designated DRS zones during Free practice and Qualifying. During both races however, the drivers will only be allowed to activate DRS within the designated zones when they are within less than a second of the car in front at the detection point.
- 2. During the race, the DRS is available for use after two laps unless decided otherwise by the race director due to poor weather conditions or yellow flags in the designated DRS zones.
- 3. The DRS zones will be the same as the ones used in Formula 1 on every circuit of the calendar.
- 4. The same safety rules apply: the DRS is disabled at the end of the designated zones, and the first time the driver uses the brakes after activation. No individual developments or upgrades are permitted in the series, and all spare parts must be purchased directly from the F2 championship organisers. Repairs of structural components must be carried out by Dallara in order to ensure integrity.

He will be joined by the first female to race a Porsche in the Middle East with Bulgarian driver Alexandria Vateva committing to the full series, while successful Italian racing team Fulgenzi racing makes its debut with driver and team head Enrico Fulgenzi behind the wheel.

Established in 2009 as the Porsche GT3 Cup Challenge Middle East, the racing series was upgraded to being named the Porsche Carrera Cup Middle East in time for the 2023/24 season.

As one of only 12 Porsche Carrera Cup series worldwide, it's part of an exclusive club that provides a perfect platform for local and international racing drivers or professional racing teams to participate in the region.

#### INTRODUCTION

Debuting in 2023, F1 ACADEMY was formed as an ambitious new project from Formula 1 to develop and prepare female drivers to progress to higher levels of competition.

The category is designed to give drivers access to more track time, racing and testing, as well as support with technical, physical, and mental preparations. Based at a Formula 4-level, F1 ACADEMY provides young talent in junior categories with access to the fundamental level of experience needed to progress to Formula 3 and join the Road to F1.

Across its two action-packed seasons so far, F1 ACADEMY has produced 13 different race winners, including Champions Marta García and Abbi Pulling. To support their progression, F1 ACADEMY provided each Champion with a fully funded seat for their subsequent campaign, with García competing in the Formula Regional European Championship by Alpine in 2024 and Pulling racing in the GB3 Championship in 2025.

For the first two seasons, five teams, who have impressive pedigrees in multiple junior categories, including F2 and F3, fielded a total of 15 drivers. The teams involved are all known for their experience and expertise in nurturing young talent and will help the drivers take their next step on their journey in competitive motorsport.

In 2024, an additional Wild Card entry was introduced at select rounds to help strengthen the talent pool in the regions where F1 ACADEMY races and prioritises talented young drivers from each race region.

For 2025, the grid has expanded to 18 cars, with Hitech TGR joining as F1 ACADEMY's sixth team. In addition, the British outfit will operate the Wild Card entry at all seven rounds.

The third season of F1 ACADEMY features a seven-round calendar, totalling 14 races, all in support of the FIA Formula One World Championship. Featuring a variety of Grand Prix circuits across three continents, the calendar has been designed to provide the field with challenging circuits to develop their technical skills on.

Each race weekend will feature one Qualifying session and two Races, the first of which is a reverse grid race. This means that managing the weekend in order to maximise points will be crucial in order to be crowned the 2025 F1 ACADEMY Champion.

Partnerships with some of the most respected brands in motorsport – such as Pirelli, Autotechnica and Tatuus – will ensure that the category remains technically advanced, while, crucially remaining affordable.

F1 ACADEMY is a one-make racing series consisting of 18 identical cars, including one Wild Card entry, split across six teams. All drivers must be women and 25 years of age or younger, and 16 years of age or older when entering their first race event of the season.

Additionally, all drivers may only compete in two seasons of the series. All drivers participating in F1 Academy must hold a Grade B, C or D International Circuit FIA Licence.

In Qualifying, each driver's fastest lap will set the grid for Race 2. The starting grid for Race 1 will be set by reversing the top eight drivers from Qualifying, with drivers in ninth to 18th starting where they qualified.

#### **POINTS ATTRIBUTION**

Two points will be awarded to the driver that is shown on pole position on the final grid for Race 2. For Race 1, points will be awarded to the top eight classified drivers in a sliding scale of 10 points for the winner, 8, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2 and one point for P8. For Race 2, the top 10 classified drivers will score 25, 18, 15, 12, 10, 8, 6, 4, 2 and 1 points respectively.

In each race, one point will be awarded to the driver who achieves the fastest valid lap time, provided she was in the top eight positions of the final classification of Race 1 or the top 10 positions for Race 2. No point will be awarded to the driver who achieved the fastest lap but is not within the applicable top eight or 10 classified drivers in the final classification, or if the leader has completed less than 50 % of the scheduled race distance.

If a race is shortened or suspended, no points will be awarded if the leader has completed less than two laps. Additionally, no points will be awarded unless a minimum of two laps have been completed by the leader without a Safety Car intervention.

### TYRE ALLOCATION

The sporting regulations state that for a round with two Free Practice sessions and two races, each car will have eight rear dry-weather tyres. For a round with less than two Free Practices or races, six front and six rear dry-weather tyres will be available. Per event, each driver will have four front and four rear wet-weather tyres.

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
